News from Imperial



Research from Imperial has found that bees exposed to pesticides don't fly as far as other bees. The study showed that bees exposed to a common type of pesticide - called a neonicotinoid fly shorter distances and for less time. This could lead to bee colonies going hungry and reduce their ability to pollinate the plants we rely on.

Mystery knee bone

A bone in our knees that was thought to have disappeared through evolution has made a surprising comeback. A new study from Imperial found that the small bone – called the fabella – is becoming more common. As the bone is so rare, scientists aren't sure what it does, but think that better nutrition could explain its resurgence.



Rainforest radio

Imperial have designed new audio recorders to capture the sounds of the rainforest in

Borneo. The sound recordings will help scientists and local people study the effect of human activities – like logging – on the plants and animals living in the forest.

Open to any women living or working in the north of Hammersmith and Fulham, the Agents of Change network brings together women from a wide range of backgrounds to share their expertise, resources and ideas to drive positive social change.

Members of the network meet four times each year and are supported by a group of local organisations, champions and mentors to develop new ideas and projects that can make a real difference in our local community.

A key part of the network is the Agents of Change leadership programme. Designed by female community leaders, the six-month leadership programme is open to members of the network who are active in their community and looking to develop their leadership skills. Starting in October and running once a month, each session focuses on different aspects of leadership and professional development, including communication and influence, confidence, project management and networking.

The network and its leadership programme are providing an exciting platform to drive positive change in White City. We meet some of the people involved.
